“And there were some shepherds in that part of the country who were spending the night in the fields, taking care of their flocks. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone over them. They were terribly afraid, but the angel said to them, “Don’t be afraid! I am here with good news for you, which will bring great joy to all the people. This very day in David’s town your Savior was born – Christ the Lord!”

(Luke 2:8-11)

When God acts in our lives it can be in a really unpredictable manner. In fact, throughout human history, it has been difficult for people to know exactly what God is up to. The above passage is both well-known as well as dear to our hearts. We can see in our mind’s eye these simple shepherds; they are minding their own business, the business of raising sheep. It is, it would appear, like so many other countless nights which they have spent in lonely vigil as they care for their flocks. Another night of watching and listening carefully with seemingly only the stars to be in company with them. It is certainly a profession which many of us would not enjoy – the solitude, the cold quiet interrupted only by the occasional bleat of a lamb not yet at rest. Yes, a night pretty much like any other night....

In the flash of a moment, however, their lives are changed; in an instant their existence is altered. They are horribly frightened in the manner in which this news is shared. It doesn’t come by official proclamation from the government or gossip in the marketplace. These humble people are chosen by God to be the audience of a messenger who brings incredible news, wonderful news. It is a message which *drives* them to hurry and to share.

Like the shepherds, we, too, are caught unawares by a loving God who gifts us with the precious present of his Son. Our lives can never be the same after we have heard the Great News that grabs at our hearts and takes us to a place where we would otherwise not be under our own power and decision. And it is because we

have received this wonderful news that we are also driven to share, driven to carry this message for those who have yet to receive it in their hearts. It is one thing to hear a message; it is quite another to have that message *change* your heart.

The history of the promise of the birth of the Messiah, the coming of Jesus into the world is richly recounted in Old Testament scripture. In fact, it is well likely that the very shepherds in our passage heard the story of hopeful prophecy again and again from parents and grandparents while learning their faith at very young ages. They believed in the God who had not forgotten them, for God is constantly about the business of remembering. Like a doting parent, God remembers our needs and well recognizes that our chief need is that of a Savior. The question put basically is this: Will we respond to our Lord’s remembering of us with the same enthusiasm that the shepherds did centuries ago? The shepherds “hurried off” to Bethlehem as is told later on in scripture. I don’t know about you, but I have never seen sheep *hurry*, which would indicate that these men dropped everything and took off to witness the beginnings of a life that would change the world. With this great day, God calls upon us to drop the routine, the norm, the customary schedule. We are reminded, as we are remembered, that God calls us together to be his people, to serve others even as we serve him. Jesus Christ, Savior of the world, has come into our lives and we will never be the same.

Take the opportunity to worship regularly as we begin our Advent season on the edge of December; plan to attend Advent services which will be held each Wednesday evening at 7 p.m. Services for our Christmas Holyday will take place Christmas Eve at 5 pm and 11 pm and Christmas Day at 10 am. May this be a Christmas season in which the Christ Child brings new meaning to your faith journey.

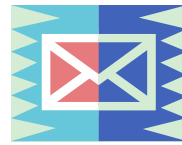

- **ADMINISTRATION, FINANCE, PROPERTY**

Pastor's Report:

Pastor conversed with the other two ELCA churches in regard to attending a possible confirmation retreat in early 2010 at Crossways. Confirmation is going very well. Pastor's report is forthcoming.
