Lent. It is an interesting word which we have heard so many times and yet for many of us the meaning could be shrouded a bit in mystery. Lent, in the infant Christian Church, was at one time a period of preparation for new believers who would be received into the body of Christ on Holy Saturday, immediately before the day of Easter. The word *lencten*, from the Middle English which was used from about the year 1000 to 1500, means *spring*. Spring is certainly a season that we look forward to at this time of year; however, even more we are anticipating the Passion of Christ which begins with the observance of Ash Wednesday. Every season in the church year has its own unique flavor, its own reason for being a part of the church cycle. Lent offers us a time as the people of God to slow down our routines, to be mindful of our practice of prayer, to rediscover our attachment to Scripture (this is perfectly timed with the fact that we are currently involved with dual Book of Faith discussions which are taking place in the life of the church – please look at your calendar for more information!) and to take stock of our spiritual lives.

The forty days of Lent have often been seen in the past by many as a representation of the time which Jesus spent in the Wilderness just prior to his public ministry. During that time (and most certainly at others), he was tempted to leave the path which the Father had set before him. True to his mission, Jesus was perfectly obedient to the will of God and would not let us down. We, throughout our days on this earth, are well aware of the many and various wildernesses which trouble us. Often we may ask ourselves the question that has been common through the ages: “If I believe in God, why do I find myself in so much pain? If God loves me, why does he not protect me from harm and ill?” The victims who have survived the tragedy in Haiti have likely asked themselves the same question.

Why do we feel ourselves so distant from God when we try so hard to be faithful? The answer is that, though Christ has claimed us as his own, we are not spared the pains of this world any more than he was. Our actions bring us no closer to God. Very certainly, he who did not sin knew the sin of all who have ever lived. It is *our* shortcomings which he willingly took upon his shoulders as he allowed himself to be mounted to the cross. It is his act, and his alone, which restores our relationship with God.

Lent is about Life, our lives. It is about building up one another in the faith in the presence of the Spirit. It is about recognizing the care and love which our Saviour has for us as we repeatedly come to repentance for all the times that we miss the mark in serving our God. **DEAD SEA SCROLLS
EXHIBIT AT
MILWAUKEE
PUBLIC MUSEUM:**

You may have heard that there is an exhibition of the Dead Sea Scrolls at the Milwaukee Public Museum. They will be on display through June 6th. Saturday tours are from 8 am to 7 pm. Groups of 15 or more are subject to a \$2 discount. If you have interest in seeing this once-in-a-lifetime display, *please* make sure to sign up in the hallway. Our numbers will decide if we drive by car or consider renting a school bus with another church.

Dead Sea Scrolls and the Bible: Ancient Artifacts, Timeless Treasures brings together archaeological objects and manuscripts to tell a story 2,000 years in the making. Witness actual Dead Sea Scrolls and other early biblical artifacts to learn how transmission of these early writings has shaped the beliefs of Judaism and Christianity and influenced aspects of Islam.

The largest temporary exhibit ever produced by the Milwaukee Public Museum, *Dead Sea Scrolls and the Bible* explores the archaeological history of the Holy Land during the period the Scrolls were written, from the third century BCE through the first century CE. The exhibit also tracks the discovery of the first Scrolls and subsequent realization of their extraordinary significance.

Silent Sunday: An Introduction to Centering Prayer

"Be still and know that I am God, the Holy One, the Almighty" Ps 46:10

We may think of prayer as thoughts or feelings expressed in words. However, there is another way of praying. It is the opening of mind and heart – our whole being- to God, the Ultimate Mystery, the Great Spirit, beyond thoughts, words, and emotions.

Centering prayer is a method designed to facilitate the union with God by preparing our faculties to receive this gift. Centering Prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer; rather it casts a new light and depth on the meaning of them. It is at the same time building a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship.

During this three hour session, we will explore prayer as relationship, learn the four guidelines of the practice of centering prayer, and experience the prayer in a group. We will also hear from Fr Thomas Keating through video. Although this is an ancient prayer, Fr Thomas began teaching the practice of the prayer in the 1980's. We recommend his book *Open Mind, Open Heart* for persons new to the prayer, and *Centering Prayer and Inner Awakening* by Cynthia Bourgeault. Also visit the international website:

Facilitator **Ann Koerner, CSA**, is a member of Contemplative Outreach International and the Contemplative Outreach of South Eastern Wisconsin (COSEW) where she serves on the leadership team. She facilitates a weekly prayer group in Milwaukee and is a certified presenter of the centering prayer seven session introductory program. Ann has been involved in directing retreats and spiritual counseling for many years and is a graduate of the Christian Spirituality Program from Creighton University.
