“Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you.”

(Isaiah 60:1-2)

The above passage is a portion of our Old Testament lesson for the Day of Epiphany. “Epiphany” is from the Greek which means to “show” or “reveal”. Epiphany is always on January 6 which makes for a very brief Christmas season; too brief in my mind. Measuring it by weeks, we spend twice the time preparing for Christmas as we do celebrating it.

But here we are: If the trees and decorations have not already been put out, they are staring at us, reminding us that the time is nigh. We take time at this juncture of the year to remember the Baby Jesus who was visited by the Gentile Magi, the wise men who, though they were not of Jewish tradition, knew a good thing when they saw it and so followed a star faithfully for many miles until it rested over the birthplace of the King. They were not of the “Chosen Tribes” of Israel and yet recognized the wealth of God’s love whose passion for his own creation embraces a world of people made strangers through sin.

When you think about it, we are all strangers and all Magi; we grow up in a world of temptations which so often takes us to rebellious attitudes that drive us from God. Like the Magi, we see a glimpse of our Lord’s grace in many ways which cause us to journey beyond our routines, searching. To be sure, the Light did not “die out” in the Middle East after the discovery of the Christ Child. Indeed, it only burned brighter for others to discover, to

know, to come to believe. It continued to burn at the Jordan River, on the Mount of Olives, at Gethsemane, Calvary and at the tomb in the garden.

The Light burns for us today as we rediscover and explore our own spiritual connection with God and as we are able to sense our being searched out and redeemed in order to be driven by God’s Spirit to do powerful works of mercy in his name. Epiphany is not a speed bump as we rush headlong from Christmas to Lent; it is a time to contemplate our faith and our deep bond with our Lord and Saviour, Jesus, who reveals his love and purpose in our lives anew.

May you always be searched out with all-embracing love of Jesus!

Old sheets, quilts, bedspreads, mattress pads, blankets, and used clothing if quilt squares can be cut from it (no jeans, please).

We quilt on every Tuesday morning from 9:00 a.m. until noon (bring your lunch and stay – coffee is provided). You can come and stay as long as you wish, there is no set time. 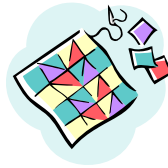

Beginning quilting Class Supply List

Rotary Cutter & Cutting Mat
Fat Quarters of Coordinating fabrics

For Baby Quilt size 48 x 57	6 fat quarters
Lap Quilt size 57 x 75	12 fat quarters
Twin Quilt size 66 x 93	18 fat quarters
Full Quilt size 84 x 93	24 fat quarters
Queen size 93 x 102	30 fat quarters
King size 120 x 120	48 fat quarters

Please purchase 100% cotton fabric. No polyester!

If you don't know what a fat quarter is just ask at the fabric shop and they will help you. The easiest way to choose fabric is to pick one focus print you like with lots of colors in it. Then choose your other fabrics from colors in the focus fabric. Or ask at the fabric shop for fat quarters from the same fabric line.

The quilt we are making is called "Yellow Brick Road". Cost of pattern is \$8.00. This pattern works with all kinds of prints or designs. It makes a great flannel baby quilt or a nice lap quilt for cold winter nights watching TV.

You will not need sewing machines for this first class. We will just be cutting our fabrics.
