For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast. Ephesians 2:8-9

At the end of October, Church of Our Saviour will join with churches throughout the world to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the start of the Protestant Reformation. October 31 marks the day that a relatively obscure German monk named Martin Luther nailed 95 theses to the door of All Saints' Church in Wittenberg.

As we get closer to the anniversary, you'll hear more about Luther's life and his lasting impact. This month, I've decided to explore the era and setting in which Luther's message took hold. The 25 years leading up to 1517 were an era of incredible transition in Europe. It was the beginning of the High Renaissance, when new ideas began to replace the systems of the Middle Ages. Contemporaries from this period are still household names: Leonardo da Vinci, Michelangelo, Raphael, Henry VIII, Thomas More, Machiavelli, Erasmus, Magellan, Cortés, Amerigo Vespucci, Copernicus.

In 1492, Columbus's journey across the Atlantic challenged the boundaries of the known world. For millennia, the borders of Europe had been more or less static. But now, new lands and markets were suddenly opened: new sources of wealth and power. The status quo no longer worked. It was also in this period when 200 years of dissatisfaction with the institutional church came to a head. Beginning in the 1300s, the Papacy had moved from Rome to a lovely city in the south of France called Avignon.

It became apparent that the leaders of the church were more concerned with things temporal than Eternal.

And in this crowded world of new ideas and new opportunities, the words of this minor monk in Wittenberg named Martin set into motion what is now called the Protestant Reformation. It was a revolution based on the Gospel of Jesus Christ: salvation by grace through faith on account of Jesus Christ. But Luther's message wasn't new: rather, it was the heart of Christianity.

And now, 500 years later, the centrality of the Gospel remains the core of our Lutheran Christian tradition. This Gospel is at the center of our worship, the sacraments, and our mission into the world. This is the legacy that we celebrate this year.

FABRIC KITS

Sewing is a valuable skill, one that leads to a reliable income for many women and men. Fabric Kits supply vocational training programs with fabric for teaching sewing, and for newly trained tailors to launch their sewing businesses.

Include the following items in each Fabric Kit:

- Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester); fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:
 - o 2 1/4 yards of 60" wide fabric, or
 - o 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
 - o 4 yards of 36" wide fabric
- Two spools of matching general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each
