Among the shoppers were several first-timers who were overwhelmed with the generosity and support they felt as they saw the gifts you had donated. As usual, there were a huge amount of donations for us to organize for the shoppers. The parents and kids are excited to see sweaters, hoodies, winter jackets and all the things that will keep them warm. Special needs for . our next closet opening on Thursday, December 18 are girls undies-size 12 and size 6, snow pantssize 10/12, size 14/XL, sweatpants-size 14, size 16, boys pajamas-size 4, size 5, size 10/12, size 14(XL), girls pajamas-size 14(XL). As always, any other clothing you share will be used. Rather than wait until Christmas to adopt one or two families, we decided to purchase food to make up 20 emergency food bags for those families in need. Food had also been brought directly to Riverside, so that was added to our bags. There were a few families who said they were doing all right, but most responded to the food with tears. We gave away more than half of what we purchased. The remaining food • was brought to the school office at the end of the day. They will see that it gets to where it is needed. Advent is upon us already. Advent is a season of holy waiting- a time to slow down, breathe deeply, and make room for the Christ's light to break into our world once again. However, waiting doesn't mean sitting still. In Scripture, God's people wait by preparing their hearts, strengthening their communities, and practicing hope in everyday ways.

This Advent I invite you and your households to take on a small, interactive practice that helps you watch for God's presence as you wait for Immanuel- God with us. Here are a few simple ideas:

- 1. Kindness Countdown- instead of opening a door on a calendar, write small acts of kindness on slips of paper and each day draw one!
- 2. Three-minute nightly prayer- Take 3 minutes, either silently or with a family member to pray: Thank You (one thing you're grateful for), Help Me (one thing you need courage for), and Be Near (one person or situation you are praying for)
- 3. Advent Check-Ins: pick one or two people you want to stay connected with during this season. Once a week, send them a text or short note (thinking of you, praying for you, etc.)
- 4 Looking for Light- Each day, look around you for a moment of beauty. Snap a picture or jot a note about what you noticed. However you practice waiting this season, may these small acts make room for hope, peace, love, and joy to grow in, and through, you this Advent.
