

SPRING EVENT AT OSHKOSH

The 2024 WELCA Combined Oshkosh/Appleton Conference Spring Event will be held on Saturday, April 20, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church, 1860 Wisconsin Street, Oshkosh. Registration begins at 8 a.m.

The theme is "Good Neighbors", based on Christ Our Savior's experience sponsoring a Syrian family this past year. The main speaker will be Tara Koji, an Oshkosh North High School teaching assistant, who has a classroom of refugee students. Just Fare from Fond du Lac will be present with merchandise from their store, and Susan Schnoor will share Just Fare's history and the countries they work with.The in-kind gifts this year will be divided between the Oshkosh North classroom and Birdies Box. Suggested items include hygiene products, toothpaste and toothbrushes, body wash, deodorant, sanitary napkins and tampons along with snack and grocery items (no glass containers).

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS REPORT

The Property Committee continues to work on the project list that was approved for inclusion in the 2023 Capital Improvements Campaign. Current status includes:

- Bill Grede has been hired to repair the east parking lot main entrance doors, at a cost of \$1800 - \$2000, which is significantly less that the original estimated replacement cost of \$12,500.
- Capelle Brothers & Diedrich will install new Main Street education wing doors after Easter.
- Ideal Glass has been contacted about taking down the current plexiglass stained glass window protectors and replacing them with clear glass.
- Bids have been solicited for a new elevator lobby heater.
- Klapperich Flooring will begin installation
 of the kitchen floor on Saturday, April 13 to
 minimize disruption to Bright Beginnings. The
 kitchen will not be available that weekend.
 Installation of the hall and gathering space
 floors will begin the following Monday, April
 15. Activities and traffic should be kept to a
 minimum during the new floor installation.
- Property will paint the upper classroom hallway after Easter but before April 13th.
 Prep work for painting (cleaning, patching, taping) will begin immediately.
