Thank you to all who donated for the Lutheran World Relief School Kits in July and August. We plan on gathering the supplies and packing the items in a backpack on **September 16th at 1 PM in Stecker Hall.** We should have enough supplies to send 60 Kits. FABRIC KITS

Fabric Kits are collected in the months of September and October. Sewing is a valuable skill, one that leads to a reliable income for many women and men. Fabric kits supply vocational training programs with fabric for teaching sewing, and for newly trained tailors to launch their sewing businesses

The following items are in each Fabric Kit:

- Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester); fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:
 - 2 1/4 yards of 60 " wide fabric, or 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
 - 4 yards of 36" wide fabric
- Two spools of matching general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each

Donations of one or more kit items and money donations are appreciated. Please make check out to WELCA and note on memo Fabric Kits. Donations may be brought to church on Sunday or to the office during weekly office hours. They can be placed in the credenza marked LWR. Thank you.

Pastor Andy Flatt-Kuntze will be guest pastor at the 9 a.m. worship service on Sunday, September 21, as part of our Centennial Year Celebration. The son of longtime COOS members Barbara Maher-Flatt and Roger Flatt, Andy was confirmed by Pastor Bob Rosenberg with the COOS Confirmation Class of 2008. After graduation from Fond du Lac High School, he completed his undergraduate degree at UW-Oshkosh in 2015 and his M.Div. at Pacific Lutheran Seminary in 2019. During seminary, he interned at the Lutheran Church of Honolulu, Hawaii and served a short-term assignment in Shishmaref, Alaska before being called as pastor of Emmaus Lutheran in Falmouth, Maine, where he was ordained on September 20, 2020.

In September, 2023, Pastor Andy began his ministry as Lead Pastor of University Lutheran Church in Seattle, a progressive community where faith is less about having all the answers and more about living into the mystery with curiosity and courage. At University Lutheran, the Gospel does not collect dust; it disrupts the comfortable, liberates the captive, gathers people together, and propels them into a world renewed in love. Pastor Andy shares life with his husband and best friend, Justin, a skilled sous chef, ever-willing travel companion, and the constant eye-roller at his jokes. He is captivated by history because it tells the truth of where humanity has been, driven by justice because it demands deliberate choices about where it is going, and devoted to stories because they hold the power to transform lives.

Following Jesus, Pastor Andy believes, is a revolutionary act in which strangers are embraced, the broken are lifted, and love transcends the borders people draw. He feels called to proclaim that welcome clearly, confront the world's injustices relentlessly, and lead the community toward an ever-resurrecting hope. Whether in worship, around a shared table, or on journeys across the world, he believes the church is at its most alive when it listens with care and empathy, acts with resolve, and lets love blaze the path forward.

Fond du Lac native David Heller has risen to prominence as an outstanding organist in the United States and beyond. The American Organist has described him as "an eloquent performer," and his playing as "an excellent demonstration of outstanding music making on a contemporary American organ." He has performed extensively throughout the United States and in Canada, France, Germany, Guatemala, Mexico, and South Korea. Dr. Heller holds degrees from Lawrence University and the Eastman School of Music, which awarded him the Performer's Certificate in Organ. He has been on the music faculty at Trinity University in San Antonio TX since 1986 and currently serves as Associate Organist at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in San Antonio.

- What church events or traditions (potlucks, youth trips, music programs, forums, etc.) are unforgettable to you?

Service & Outreach

- How has the church made a difference in the community or in the wider world?
- Have you been part of a program, group, project or outreach ministry that deeply touched you or others?
- What did you learn about serving God and serving people here?

Change & Continuity

- What changes have you seen in the church over the years?
- In what ways has the heart of the church remained the same?
- Do you remember a time when the church helped people through a difficult season?

Looking Ahead

- What do you hope future generations will carry forward from this church's legacy?
- What blessings, prayers, or words of encouragement would you share with those who will worship here in the next 100 years?
