COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

- Pastor Crystal is convening a small committee of long-time members to help with the process of updating our membership rolls.
- After input and approval from the donor, an anonymous donation of \$23,000 was designated as follows: Prayer Garden - \$5,000; handbell refurbishing - \$1,000; establishment of an elevator replacement fund - \$17,000.
- Proceeds from the Council's Lenten supper will be used to provide a taco bar on May 16 and pay for other "wish list" items at Cafe Q, a project that provides a safe gathering space for LBGTQ youth at the Open Circle Unitarian Church on E. 3rd Street.
- A new heater will be installed soon in the elevator lobby by Fenner Plumbing & Heating, as part of the capital campaign improvements.
- 83 people attended the Mariachi Mexico concert on March 30. Taco meal expense was covered in part by a grant from Kwik Trip.


