#### SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2025

Gathered under the theme "To Serve all People Following the Example of Jesus" the East Central Synod of Wisconsin (ECSW) held its Synod Assembly on Saturday, June 7, 2025. Merle Knudtson and I served as delegates for Church of Our Saviour.

After opening worship Bishop Anne Edison-Albright called the assembly to order. Throughout the day we conducted the business of the assembly. This included the adoption of the 2026 Synod Budget, approval of the 2026 Minimum Compensation Guidelines, and passage of three major resolutions.

We also conducted elections for Synod Council and Consultation Committee members, extended our gratitude to outgoing Synod Council members, celebrated the ordination anniversaries of Rostered Ministers, and gave thanks for the saints who have entered the Kingdom of God.

The Synod celebrated with us as we celebrate 100 years as a congregation. We also had a chance to learn about partners in our Synod. I encourage you to go to the Synod Website to explore in more detail what I have summarized. The website is www.ecsw.org.

- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

- ♦ One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)
- ♦ One standard eraser- 2 1/2"

## ELEVATOR UPDATE

The Property Committee is working with the Otis Elevator Company to come up with a solution as to why sometimes the elevator will not open up at the top floor. The committee is confident Otis is the best choice to work on this intermittent issue.

If this were to happen to you, please send the elevator down to the basement level and try again to go to the top floor. On the second try, the elevator door should open, allowing you to enter into the top floor. If the door still won't open, return to the ground level and exit the elevator. Please stand in the center of the elevator rather than by the door.

The property committee has been informed that, eventually, the control panel with all its relays, contacts, and other electrical components will need to be replaced. The estimated cost, including labor, is \$150,000. Since we haven't finished the Capital Improvement Campaign yet, we would like to hold off, if possible, starting a campaign to update our elevator sometime after the Capital Improvement Campaign has been completed. If it is determined that we cannot wait, but need to address the elevator issue sooner, the Property Committee along with the Finance Committee will address the issue.
