We are entering November, and my 1 year anniversary with Church of Our Saviour. The year here has flown by with so many different activities happening throughout the year. It has been a year of learning and understanding each other. I have learned about the traditions of Church of Our Saviour, and I brought new ideas. There were some changes in the year, And there are more changes to come. Know that as we continue to journey together, in the changes both the ones we are excited for and the ones we are hesitant about, we will be listening to hear where God is calling us to next. I want to take a moment to highlight one of the changes that has already started which I am really excited about. At the end of September/beginning of October, confirmation changed. I am excited to report the distribution of our 2022 MobilePack, as follows:

- 396 boxes, i.e., 85,536 meals, have gone to Romania for Ukrainian refugees. That will feed 834 children for a year.
- 72 boxes, i.e., 15,552 meals, have gone to Haiti to feed another 42 children for a year. Thanks to all of you who helped make this possible. God's work accomplished through His servants.
