


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#### From the Pastor

Greetings, Beloveds!

We have finished the first month of 2024! And with that, we are about to move on to Ash Wednesday and Lent. Lent is early this year with Ash Wednesday being February 14 (yes, Valentine's Day!).

For Lent this year, our theme for both Sunday and Wednesday will be "Faith Foundations." We all need reminders on what and why we believe what we believe. Also opportunities to wrestle with and question what we believe. This theme offers us those opportunities.

On Sundays we will focus on "Faith Foundations: God's Promises" where we will dive into the Old Testament lessons which include foundational stories of God's promises. These stories include: God's covenant in the rainbow; God's promise to Sarah and Abraham to make them ancestors to many; the covenant and gift of the commandments; a story of a serpent and stick; and we will hear about a new covenant that God will make with Israel.

Then on Wednesdays, the theme will be "Faith Foundations: Luther's Small Catechism." The emphasis will be on our foundational beliefs as Lutherans as we look at one part of Luther's Small Catechism each week- The Creed, 10 Commandments, The Lord's Prayer, Baptism, and Communion. We will hear the question: What does this mean? And hear how these foundations continue to be important to our faith today.

I hope you will join as we take time to delve into our "Faith Foundations!"

## CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRESS REPORT

The daycare ceiling project was completed during the daycare's holiday break. The old ceiling and lights were removed and replaced with new suspended ceilings and new LED light fixtures in the north classroom and two of our storage closets. The Property Committee members made minor repairs to the ceilings in the middle and south classrooms and the existing light fixtures were upgraded to LED's. Radiators were reattached and repairs made to a couple closet doors. The floors received their annual cleaning and buffing.

Because we decided to repair instead of replacing the ceilings in two of the rooms, this project was completed for \$9,352 rather than the new bid of \$22,183. The lower level window replacement was completed in early January. Scheduling is proceeding for replacement of parish hall doors facing Main Street and the parking lot. Replacement of the elevator lobby heater is next on the schedule.

To date all the expenditures have been covered with funds already donated. We will be drawing on our approved loan soon, so that the upcoming projects can be undertaken as soon as bids are approved and schedules set.
