## FROM THE PASTOR – SPIRITUAL PRACTICES

Greetings, Beloveds!

Here in the month of July, there will be an interactive sermon series- ***Spiritual Practices***. Each week, we will learn about and exercise these various spiritual practices.

Did you know, that in the pastor's job description, here at Church of Our Saviour, there is a "Spiritual Self-Care" section? And in this section, along with my weekly day of Sabbath, there is "one day each month for participation in peer growth," AND "one full day each month for prayer as a necessary ministry of absence." When I read through the job description when interviewing here, I loved seeing that in the job description; that the congregation knew the importance for the pastor to take time away in prayer. However, I must admit, I have not taken that day of prayer.

For a two-year program I am taking, I needed to create a summer project related to class material, which includes how spiritual practices connect with leadership skills: you need to take care of yourself and your own spiritual well-being before being able to care for others. When thirty-eight jetliners bound for the United States were forced to land in Gander, Newfoundland, on September 11, 2001, due to the closing of United States airspace, the citizens of Gander, Newfoundland were called upon to come to the aid of more than six thousand displaced travelers. Nearly every man, woman, and child in Gander and the surrounding smaller towns stopped what they were doing so they could help. They placed their lives on hold for a group of strangers and asked for nothing in return.

A #1 bestseller in Canada, ***The Day the World Came to Town*** is a positively heartwarming account of the citizens of Gander and the unexpected guests who were welcomed with exemplary kindness.

## ELECTRONIC BULLETINS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

As of June 26, our worship bulletin and announcements can be viewed and downloaded to your smart phone, iPad or tablet using the QR code that is posted in the sanctuary entrance. We are aware that more and more people prefer to use smart phones or tablets rather than printed copies. From the church's perspective, producing fewer paper copies will save on printing costs and support the conservation and wise stewardship of our natural resources.

If you are not familiar with using QR codes, free apps for that purpose are available in the Google PlayStore (Android phones/tablets) or the Apple store (iPhones/iPads). Search on "QR code reader" and install one with a high user rating.

Once installed, the app uses your phone camera to read the code and link to the appropriate website.
