WINTER WEATHER

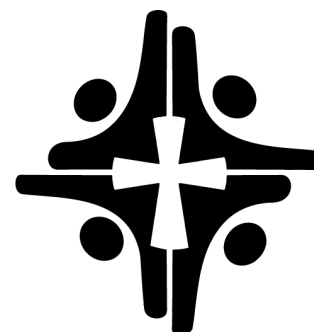
