

THRIVENT CHOICE Dollars

Dear Members,

If you have Thrivent products that qualify for Thrivent Choice Dollars you can designate these dollars to Church of Our Saviour or a charity of your choice. (These are free dollars that Thrivent gives you as a fraternal Insurance company when you have products with them.)

To be eligible to direct Choice Dollars as part of Thrivent Choice, you must be a client with benefit membership. Individual eligibility is also based on at least one of the following:

- Having \$750 or more in annual billed premiums of qualifying life and health insurance products.
- Having \$20,000 or more in contract value of qualifying life insurance and annuity products.

Designation of your dollars needs to be done by March 31, 2024. All you need to do is:

- Go to thrivent.com and log in to your account.
- Go to MEMBERSHIP OVERVIEW tab and click on it.
- Scroll down to THRIVENT CHOICE and click on DIRECT CHOICE DOLLARS
- Note amount of Dollars you are able to direct and follow directions to add your charity and direct your dollars.
