March 2017

Last month, we discussed the reasons *why* we baptize – in short, because Jesus told us to. Pretty simple.

So this month, we move on to the second section of Luther's catechism on baptism, which begins with this question:

What gifts or benefits does baptism grant? What do you think the benefits are? Why do we baptize people? Is it symbolic? Does it do anything? When parents bring a child to be baptized, are the benefits related to the joy of having family and friends together at church, with sponsors making holy promises on behalf of the child? Or perhaps the benefits are less about the service, and having a baptism is just a box you can check off to satisfy certain family members' expectations.

Well, both of those may seem like real benefits of a baptism, but they're not the point.

Luther's explanation of the benefits of baptism states: *It brings about forgiveness of sins, redeems from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe it, as the words and promise of God declare.*

The focus of baptism is on the relationship between God and the person receiving the sacrament. The waters of baptism bring about the forgiveness of sins. Think about that. What was plain water is now a conduit of sorts for the grace of God. That water, being poured over the head of the baptized, has a power greater than you or I could ever imagine. Not only is there forgiveness in these waters which wash our sins away, but baptism also redeems us from death and the devil. The grace that marks us, well, it sticks to us forever. It never leaves us. It's a promise that washes over us once, but remains with us from now on. But wait, there's more. This water also gives eternal life to those who believe it. That's a pretty heavy and substantial list, but how do we know it's true? Well, Luther says these are the benefits for all who believe it "as the words and promise of God declare." OK, anyone know where we can find that?

What are these words and promise of God? Our Lord Christ says in Mark 16, "The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned." It is short, it's sorta sweet, and sorta scary. But the point isn't to say who is in and who is not. Instead, it's to say that those who are baptized can trust that Jesus' promises are true. He's not in the business of overselling his promises.

So this month, we explored the benefits, but it might still make you scratch your head and say, really? Forgiveness, freedom from death, the devil, and eternal life? Doesn't the pastor just get the water from the faucet in the back? Surely that's not all. Well, next month we'll talk about that: when water is plain water, and when it is the waters of baptism.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS • February, 2017

- President Paul Kaestner opened the meeting by having members introduce themselves, including new members Richard Radke and Mary Arthur (secretary).
- Staff has been holding regular meetings on Tuesday mornings.
- Pastor Agee will use Luther's Small Catechism for our Lenten theme, including midweek services and the Adult Forum.
- Pastor conducted two funerals in the past month, made 8 hospital visits and 5 home visits.
- David Hein and the Marian University singers will provide special music for one midweek service during Lent.
- Rich and Janet Radke, along with Pastor Agee, attended the Oshkosh Conference meeting in Ripon recently. Rich offered information on the 8th Day Project in Oshkosh, a non-traditional Christian community that shares a vision for social justice and spiritual practices.
- Pastor and Janet Radke have been involved in organizing a community festival for the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, tentatively scheduled for a weekend in October.
- Property Committee report:
 - Reviewing proposals to complete railings in front of church
 - Floors on both levels have been stripped and waxed
 - Bids and City requirements for parking lot drainage and reconstruction are being reviewed
 - o Boiler leaks have been repaired
 - Follow-up with daycare staff is needed to facilitate maintenance of kitchen facilities
- Council will provide Lenten supper on March 22.
- Photo Directory—several delays prevented completion of this project. Pastor is currently checking out a new company to produce a photo directory for the congregation.
- Committee structure and council assignments were discussed. The restructuring plan developed prior to Pastor Agee's arrival will be reviewed in anticipation of updating our organizational (committee) structure.
