Happy New Year, Beloveds!

We are entering yet another new year, 2024. As we start 2024, we are still in the season of Christmas with the 12 days ending with Epiphany on January 6. We will recognize Epiphany on January 7 during worship.

My first January here, I introduced the idea of Star Words, and I am bringing them back this year. These get their names for being words written on stars providing a word to ponder all year long. On Epiphany we hear the story of the wise men traveling a long distance to bring their gifts to the newborn Christ-child. In so doing, they were responding to the gift first given to them. As we remember the arrival of the wise men and their offerings, we will receive this paper reminder that symbolizes God's generosity in our lives- and sometimes in ways that we would never expect.

So, in worship on January 7, you will have the opportunity to draw a word from a basket. These words will provide a way to be still in the presence of God, and pay attention in one specific way to God's gifts in your life. You are encouraged to hang these words somewhere you will see them each day- be it on the bathroom mirror or the refrigerator. Allow the word to speak to you. I will also try to include a monthly question to help you focus on your word.

Rather than drawing a random word for Church of Our Saviour, there has been a word I have chosen for us, as it keeps coming back to me. The 2024 word for Church of Our Saviour is: Invitation. Throughout 2024, I invite you all to see how we, individually and as a congregation, see invitation at play in the life and ministry of Church of Our Saviour.

If you are unable to join us on Jan. 7, and would like a Star Word, please reach out to me, and I will send you one.
